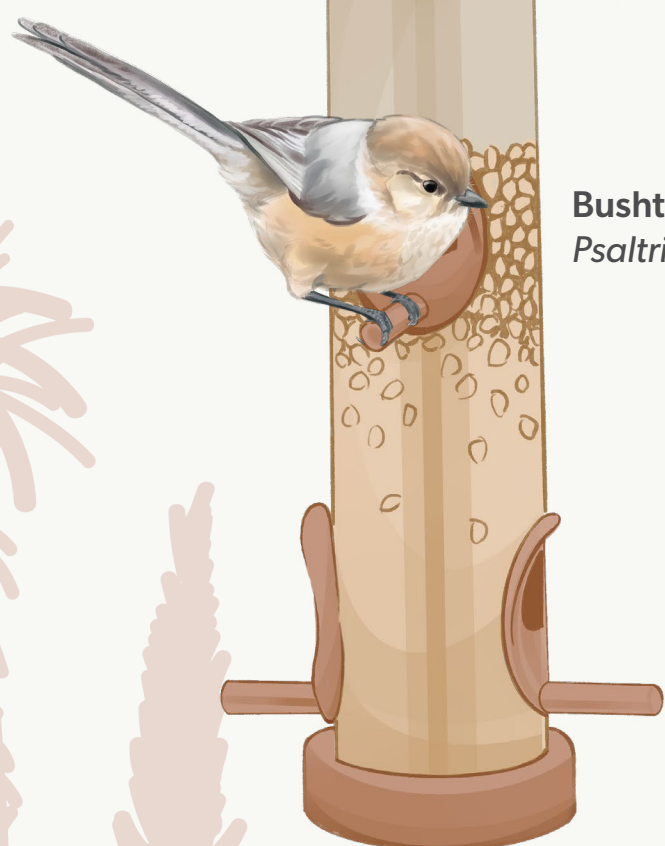

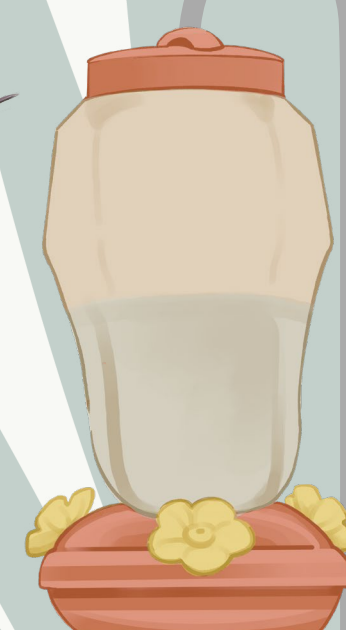

SAFE FEEDING PRACTICES

Be sure to feed the birds responsibly! Bird feeding can be good for birds as long as we prioritize birds' health with a few key considerations.



Feeder Care: Dirty feeders can make birds sick. Clean your feeders at least once every two weeks. Take them apart and remove any debris, then wash them.



Providing cover: Brush piles and shrubs can provide cover where feeder birds can hide from predators.



Windows: Birds can't tell a reflection apart from reality. Keep them safe and obscure the outside surface of windows near the feeder, or place feeders within 3 feet of nearby glass.

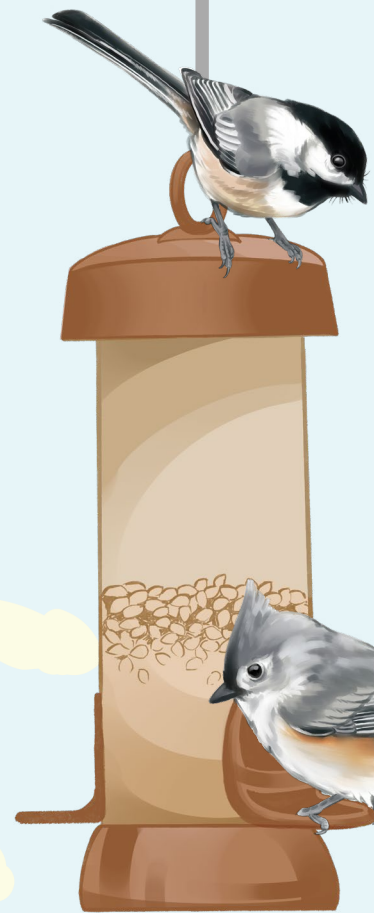


Cats: Feeding birds are especially easy prey for cats. If you have one or more cats, we strongly recommend you keep them indoors!

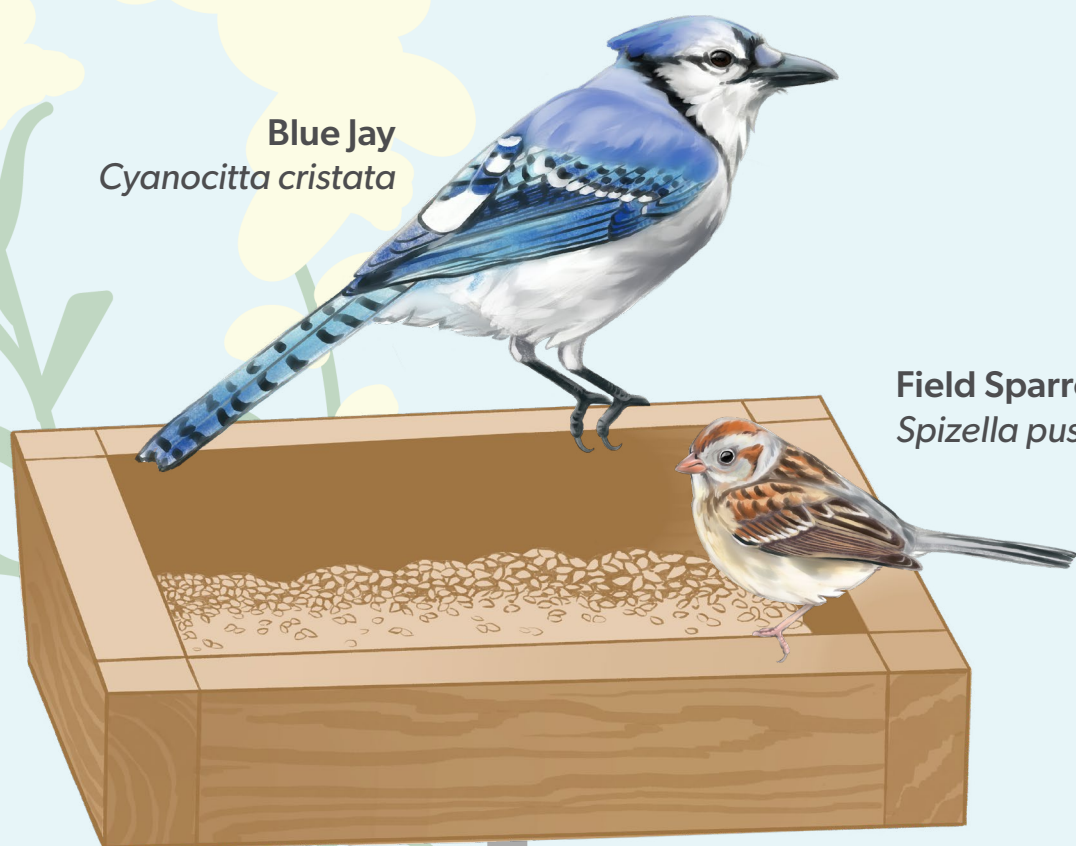

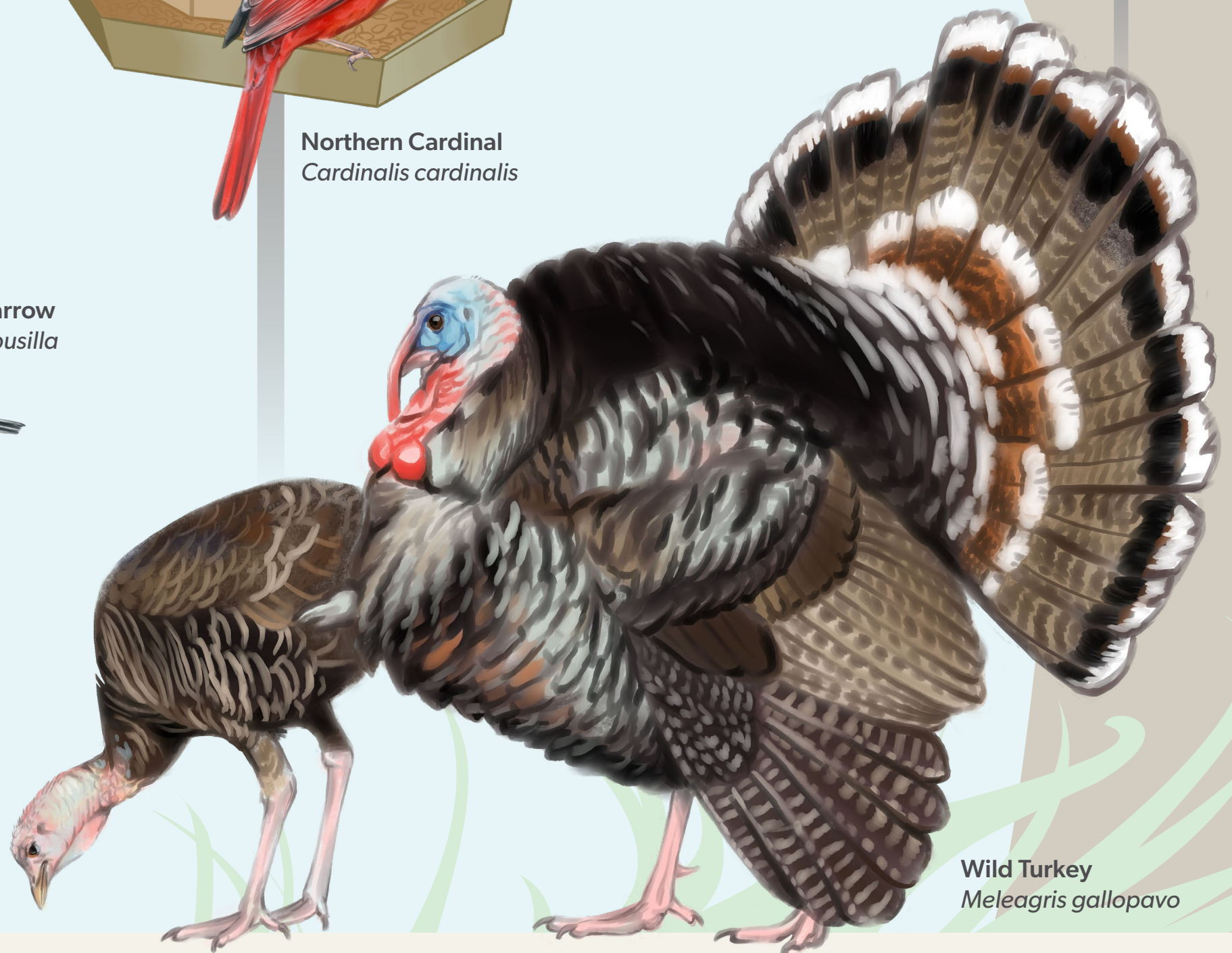
